Welcome to June.


We're off to a fine start weather wise.



The road to nowhere a.k.a. The coffin road

There aren't too many roads in and around Culbokie and they all, apart from one, have an obvious destination. The road in question leads down past the manse from the Spar shop junction. Today the road's sole purpose is to serve the various houses that have been built over the years but the houses are there because of the road and not the other way round.

The answer is that it was the most direct way to reach the Urquhart and Ferintosh Churches and the Preaching Site given that there is no obvious location for a religious building within the boundary of Culbokie and consequently the road would have seen many community processions taking the coffin to church.

Over the years the road would have lost a lot of its usefulness only serving the houses in and around the Churches and so when deciding on the design and layout of the new A9 it would have been an easy decision to sever the road. Hence it now is the "road to nowhere".
