




Find out why and how the Million Miles project wants to map routes around the Black Isle



## Culbokie Primary School

SOME Transition Black Isle wants to produce an active travel map and we're gathering data using an online map that anyone can **DETAILS!** edit - www.openstreetmap.org. We want as many people as possible to add information about their community and the routes they travel; OpenStreetMap is a great way to easily contribute lots of useful detail for walking and cycling (e.g. track surface, barriers). The data is not only vital for our map, but it will also improve online services that use OpenStreetMap (e.g. cycle routes by www.cyclestreets.net).

This will be our first Community Mapping Meeting. We'll start at 10:00am with an explanation of what we want to achieve and a quick overview of OpenStreetMap. We'll then agree which parts of Culbokie need to be mapped and head out to gather data! Anyone less confident in using OpenStreetMap will be welcome to stay for a tutorial before starting mapping. Someone will be around at the school until mid-afternoon if you have any questions. Our event is free and there will be complementary refreshments (but you might want to bring a packed lunch!). Bring along any GPS devices you may have (including smartphones) to track routes around Culbokie – especially in the woods.
