
Wildlife of South America - A Tourist's View

Fascinating Findon Facts

Coincidence I - Shortly after becoming custodians of the mill and dun at Findon in the 1980s we noticed Mr Jackson studying the mill building whilst trying to locate a suitable position to take a photograph. He was referring to an album of watercolours that Sir Kenneth Mackenzie, an ancestor of his, had painted in 1879 when he owned the Estate and Mr Jackson wanted a before and after shot of the location. Naturally we were very interested as the original water colour was the only instance, at that time, showing the mill building in its original condition. Fortunately Mr Jackson was happy to provide us with scanned copies of the water colour along with an associated one of Milton Lodge to the north of the mill building. https://history.culbokiect.org/index.asp?pageid=724474 "An historical drive through Culbokie."

Coincidence 2. - Jumping forward a few decades our interest in the history of Findon Mills had been kept alive with the activities of the History of Culbokie Group. Occasionally the Group is approached by families researching their family history and asking for help, often with geographical questions. Elizabeth Jorgenson, Ottawa, sent us photographs taken on a visit in 1913 by an ancestor who was searching for family homes. https://history.culbokiect.org/index.asp?pageid=724517 During the correspondence Elizabeth enquired as to where in Culbokie I resided and on learning that it was at Findon Mills she sent a further photograph showing the mill in its entirety when it was being used for timber processing. Whilst the mill wouldn't have been of relevance to that search for family homes the mill must have been such a significant building as to warrant a photograph. What a bonus for our researches. Unfortunately the photograph didn't shed any light on to the location of the mill wheel, but then beggars can't be choosers.

If the answer to these questions is yes - the Green Team could be for you! Volunteers have been gathering every Thursday afternoon since last June to help look after and improve the Culbokie Green. Activities vary with the season and the weather but can include sowing seeds and plants, looking after the new meadow, caring for the orchard trees and discussing and planning new projects.





We know there will be lots to learn about looking after the Green and we're keen to arrange training and events to help with this. A training course in March on 'Meadows and Meadow Management' provided by High Life Highland drew a strong audience of 15 people and gave some important insights for managing the Green. It also, unexpectedly, sparked lots of interest in planting 'mini meadows' in gardens around the village and a new WhatsApp group was formed for people to share experiences and ideas. We hope to see these projects taking shape as spring progresses – and lots of bees buzzing around the village!

Everyone is welcome to join in although children must be accompanied by an adult. There is no long term commitment. You can just dip in and out as you please. We meet at Am Fasgadh shelter on the Green from 2-4pm every Thursday – and we always stop for a good break, a drink and a chat during the session. Occasional weekend sessions are also being planned.
