Employment at the Scottish Parliament Election

With the upcoming Scottish Parliamentary election scheduled to be held on Thursday 6 May 2021, the Highland Council's Election Team need to recruit additional people to work at the election in a polling station or at the count.

The ongoing Covid pandemic means we'll need more staff than usual to run this vital democratic process effectively, as there will be more things to do in the polling stations and the count.

Polling Station Positions

We are looking for applicants to cover polling duties in the three constituencies in Highland:

- Caithness, Sutherland and Ross
- Skye, Lochaber and Badenoch
- Inverness and Nairn

There are three key roles:

- Presiding Officer responsible for making sure that voters can cast their vote in secret, free from influence and in a calm atmosphere
- Poll Clerk assists the Presiding Officers to run the polling station
- Information Officer greets voters, manage queues and sterilise polling booths and equipment throughout the day

The counting of the votes will commence on Friday, 7 May 2021 and are being counted over several days instead of overnight. This year we have 2 counting venues - one at the Highland Football Academy in Dingwall and one at the Inverness Leisure Centre.

We are looking to recruit people to count votes.

The Elections Team need people who will always act impartially, be polite and professional with voters, candidates, agents and other officers.

Temporary Closure Business Grants - Deadline

The Scottish Government announced this week that the Strategic Framework Business Fund grant scheme will close to new applicants on 22 March 2021.

This scheme has provided Temporary Closure Grants for eligible businesses who have had to close during the tier 4 restrictions.

B&B and Self Catering Grant Scheme

B&B's and Self-catering businesses who pay Council Tax, can now for one week only, apply for grant support from the Small Accommodation Providers Paying Council Tax Fund.

Applications are invited between 15 and 22 March from eligible businesses. Grants of £2,000, payable every 4 weeks, backdated to the start of January 2021 are available.

HERO Grants for Private or Third Sector Employers

A grant of up to £6000 is available from the Council to help businesses with the costs of recruiting and employing a new member of staff.

The Highland Employment Recruitment Offer (HERO) grant is part of the Council's Economic Prosperity Fund. If you are a private or third sector employer with less than 50 employees in Highland you can apply for a 'HERO grant'.

The fund can cover the costs of employing someone including their wages, training costs, travel or other work-related costs. It is hoped that this grant will encourage employers to take on new staff who are unemployed or who have been issued with a redundancy.

Comfort Scheme Providers

As part of the £1.5 million visitor management investment strategy the Council has agreed up to £60,000 of investment for public toilet provision. In preparation for the upcoming tourist season, we are looking for additional Comfort Scheme providers to complement the existing provision of 74 public conveniences and 36 comfort schemes.

If you run a local business, village hall or hospitality service and are interested in providing facilities for tourists to access, you can sign up to the fixed term agreement for which the Council can provide you with a contribution towards your running costs, depending on the facilities you can offer.
