## **Covid update**

- Covid positive tests are slowly declining/levelling
- Infection rate has decreased now to 6.8/100,000 (28 April) decrease from last week when the rate was 15.8/100,000. 16 cases across Highland over the last 7 days so significant improvement (Scotland=24.5/100,000 last week 27.8/100,000)
- Test positivity 0.4% (0.8%)
- Small number of cases per neighbourhood majority are not being highlighted as won't disclose where there is less than 3 in any neighbourhood.
- Very important to still stick to:











## **Trend data - Highland**

## Vaccination programme update

#### **Good progress is being made in Highland:**

- For NHSH area as a whole, over 166,665 people have received their first dose of the vaccine. 65.5% of the over 16 population against a Scottish rate of 61.4%.
- Most people over 50 will now have received their vaccine although there are still
  appointments being made for some people who maybe have not yet received the
  vaccine.
- Some GP practices have set up clinics for 40-49 year olds but this is dependent on supplies
- Ask from NHS Highland for people not to call their GP. People will be contacted when appointments for their age group are ready.

## **Community testing – new offer**

- Not everyone who has coronavirus will have symptoms, so people could be spreading the disease without knowing it.
- Government has a programme to offer rapid tests for people without symptoms.
- New offer for anyone to request Lateral Flow Device kits to use at home twice per week:
  - people can register on-line to order testing kits to be sent to their home address <a href="https://test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/order-lateral-flow-kits/">https://test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/order-lateral-flow-kits/</a>;
  - People can call 0300 303 2713 if they don't have access to the internet to request test kits to make a request for a delivery.
  - People can pick these up without an appointment at many local walk-in or drive-through test sites from 3.30pm each day – in Highland this would be the two sites in Inverness and the testing site in Wick

## **Scottish Parliament Election 6 May**

- Council has been sharing about what measures are in place to make sure it is safe and secure for everyone to vote at their polling station.
- General risk assessments and specific covid risk assessments have been carried out at every polling station
- Extra staff have been recruited to help make sure the voting experience is as smooth as possible as things will look different
- Will be a limit on the number of people entering at one time
- Face coverings will be required
- Hand sanitiser available on entry and exit
- Polling station staff will be behind protective screens
- Regular cleaning at polling stations throughout the day on a regular and frequent basis

## **Scottish Parliament Election 6 May**

- Voters asked to take their own pen or pencil but if they don't have one, one will be provided from a new box of pencils for their use only
- Voters are asked to check their poll card as a different polling station may be being used this time

  - 2 ballot papers lilac one for constituency MSP and peach one for the regional list MSPs
