### Funding

• The Gordon & Ena Baxter Foundation

This fund supports capital projects that cover any of the following: education, health, care, sports, arts and heritage, and conservation and environment. Next deadline: 29 July 2022

• The Westminster Foundation - Small Grant Programme

Offers support to organisations creating opportunities for young people and helping tackle the causes and impacts of inter-generational inequality. Next deadline: Panel meets every ten weeks.

• Highlands and Islands Environment Foundation Grants

Supports projects fitting the foundations areas of interest, including - montane, fresh water, marine and costal, forest and woodland. Next deadline: September

• Highland Climate Festival Funding

Available to help enable evens/workshops/activities within communities relating to climate action.

# Community Ownership Fund – Round 2 Launched

On Friday, the <u>prospectus</u> for the second round of the UK Government's Community Ownership Fund was published. This fund helps communities take ownership of assets at risk of closure.

### What is COF?

The Community Ownership Fund is a £150m UK-wide fund that will run between 2021/22 and 2024/25 and aims to help communities take ownership of assets and amenities at risk of closure. It is open to voluntary and community organisations and supports the purchase and/or renovation costs of assets in their local area.

# How Round 2 has changed

Since Round 1, the fund has moved to a two-stage process with an initial 'Expression of Interest' stage to determine eligibility and bid readiness followed by a detailed application, which can be made to any of the three bidding windows that will be available this year.

# **Key dates**

• 'Expression of Interest' stage opens on 10<sup>th</sup> June 2022 and will remain open throughout the life of this round. This stage must be completed before submitting a detailed application.

- 1<sup>st</sup> detailed application window will close 12pm 19<sup>th</sup> August 2022
- 2 more windows before March 2023

Purpose of Fund: to deliver activities at a community garden that promotes composting at home

Value of funding available: £1,300

**Caveats to funding**: Need to register as a SF&G member (free to do so, can see Blooming Gardeners are already registered)

What Can fund be spent on? Staff time, resources, equipment (revenue and capital)

**Estimated time to complete:** I would advise 0.5 day to complete an application if eg Blooming Gardeners were to use the funding to pay for their gardeners' time to deliver a couple of composting workshops.

Deadline to complete: 5pm, June 29th
