Coronavirus Emergency Fund

CAF has launched this rapid response Fund to help smaller charitable organisations affected by the impact of Covid-19. Grants of up to £10,000 will help them to continue to deliver much needed support to our communities across the UK.

This is intended as a rapid response fund, and we aim to make payments to selected organisations within 14 days of application.

We anticipate high numbers of applicants and unfortunately it is likely that we will not be able to offer a grant to all eligible applicants.

You can apply for unrestricted funding for core costs, staffing, volunteer costs, supplies and equipment, communications or other critical charitable areas. You must be able to describe how an emergency grant will improve the situation for your organisation and community.

Please make only one application. Multiple applications will slow the process down and only one grant is possible for any organisation.

Please remember that this is intended as an emergency fund to enable your charitable activities to continue at the moment in whatever way is needed; it is not designed to replace other lost income in the longer term.

Youth Scotland's Action Fund has been established to help youth groups and youth workers meet the needs of young people in response to the Covid-19 Coronavirus.

The global Covid-19 epidemic is now making a significant and unprecedented impact on people's lives in communities throughout Scotland and the UK. The needs of young people, youth workers and youth groups have changed in this past week as our way of life is disrupted in ways we could not have previously imagined. Therefore, the purpose of this fund is to enable youth groups to purchase essential items that will enable them to continue working with young people throughout this period of social distancing and restrictions.

It is a Micro Grant fund that is being supported by some key funders, STV Children's Appeal and The Robertson Trust. We are reallocating existing funds to meet the emerging needs of youth groups. The maximum amount available per application is £500.





Saltire Awards is a special way of celebrating and recognising the volunteering achievements of young people in Scotland

What is it?

Saltire Awards is the **Scottish Governments national youth volunteer awards**. They celebrate, recognise and reward the commitment, contribution and achievements of young volunteers in Scotland, aged between **12** and **25**.

Young people gain nationally recognised certificates, signed by Scottish Government Ministers, for the different amounts of volunteering they do.

Saltire Awards helps young volunteers to reflect on, capture and communicate their learning and development gained through their volunteering.

Who is it for?

Saltire Awards is for young people between the ages of **12** and **25** and who are volunteering for the benefit of the community or a good cause.

Saltire Awards is delivered in each local authority area by the local **Third Sector Interface** (TSI) They provide support and assistance on achieving and accessing the Saltire Awards.
