## **Covid update**

- Covid positive tests are declining
- Infection rate has reduced again from 53.9/100,000 reported last week to 28.0/100,000 this week, so positive improvement
- Test positivity 1.7%
- Still need to stick to:











Majority of cases remain around the inner moray firth area

# Ambitious Highland – Health and Prosperity Strategy 2021-22

- Impact of covid and the move to recovery is at the heart of this year's budget
- Aim is to address the 4 harms of covid direct health harms, indirect health harms, societal harms and economic harms

#### Three key strands

- Strand 1 An Investment Strategy for Health and Prosperity
- Strand 2 Recovery Improvement and Transformation Fund
- Strand 3 Savings proposals to deliver a balanced budget

#### **Drivers for Change**

- Covid Recovery
- Community focused/place based approach
- Highland economy
- Climate Change

# Investment Strategy for Health & Prosperity

#### Key areas of investment:

#### **Visitor Management Strategy - £1.5m**

 Investment in roads, parking management, comfort schemes (to enhance toilet provision), enhanced litter and waste collection, provision for motorhomes

#### **Economic Prosperity Fund - £6m**

 Focus on employment opportunities particularly for young people – Modern Apprenticeships, mentoring skills, increasing training and learning opportunities, supporting business to create jobs for people out of work

#### Place Based Investment - £2.1m

 £100,000 per ward to develop local responses to covid e.g. welfare supports around food and fuel support, wellbeing investments in play parks/leisure facilities, supports around addressing mental wellbeing and loneliness

## Recovery, Improvement and Transformation

- 9 Projects aimed to support the delivery of the Council's Corporate aims and the Council's financial strategy to deliver savings by working more efficiently and effectively
- To be delivered over a 12-24 month period, projects include:
  - Waste to reduce our waste by supporting alternatives to landfill
  - Social Care in partnership with NHS Highland, transforming how social care services are delivered given the aging population and increase in population need with a focus on reducing residential care and supporting independent living
  - Digital transformation improving how customers can connect with the Council
  - Climate Change including a dedicated Food Growing Community Engagement Officer to support the identification of land for food growing/allotments to increase community involvement in food growing opportunities

# **Budget Savings for a Balance Budget**

- Making the Council More Efficient
  - Efficiencies as a result of the move to online working and reductions in travel
- Commercialisation and Income Generation
  - Cost recovery from service provision and statutory fees e.g. new licensing provision, registrar service
  - Savings from implementation of Glass Return Scheme
  - Providing Highland Virtual Academy Services to other Local Authorities
  - Increasing fares on ferry services for motorhomes
- Redesign and Improvement
  - Staff savings as a result of redesign of services to improve service delivery

# **Key Messages**

- Council tax has been frozen for the 2021/22 financial year
- Kept reserves at £24.7m which provides financial sustainability and ability to manage any risks
- Recognition of the real challenges facing communities as a result of covid - the budget enables investment in key areas in order sustain communities through this period
- Core aim to stimulate growth and recovery and thereby improve health and prosperity
