Covid update

- Covid positive tests are declining
- Infection rate has increased from 28.0/100,000 reported last week to 40.7/100,000 this week, so disappointing after positive improvement the week before (Scotland=63.8/100,000)
- Test positivity 1.7%
- As we start to see some relaxation of restrictions it's even more important to stick to:



- Majority of cases remain around the inner moray firth area
